




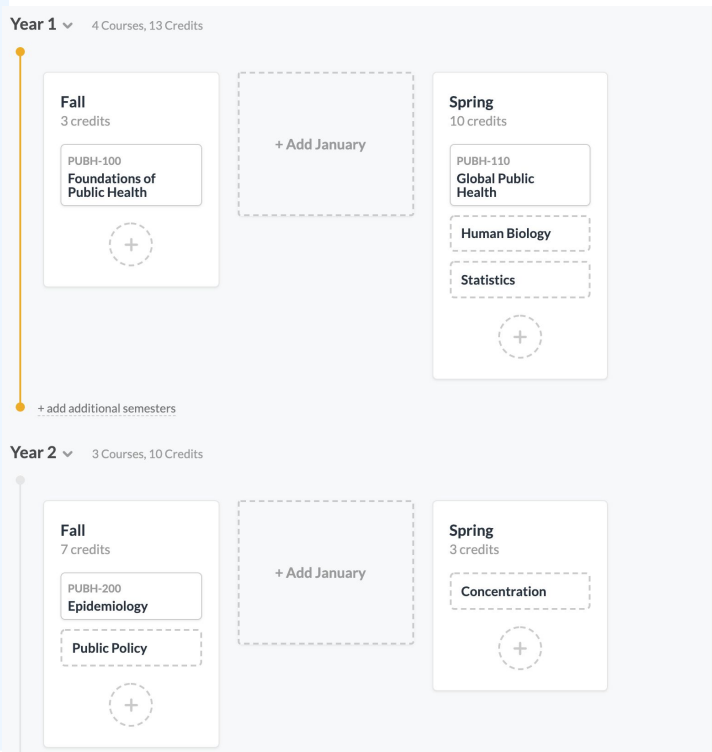

At a base level, a template is a prescribed pathway for obtaining all requirements within a degree.

Degrees can have multiple templates available.

Template Application

- Suggested graduation pathway(s)
 - Variations for early/late graduation timelines
 - Various concentrations or tracks
- Avoid students having course sequencing issues
- Add recommended courses or activities for a particular program

Increased visibility around template application

Why?

It was challenging to see:

- If a student had a template applied to their plan
- If there were available templates for the student's program
- How to change a template version

Why?

Providing a curated list instead of random list of pathways

What has changed?

Students can search for templates directly from their planner.

Students see a prioritized display of templates when browsing.

Templates to Pathways

6. Campus Experiences ⓘ

Leadership roles/organizational roles in any student clubs/organizations. For example, experience as Treasurer, Fundraising Coordinator, President/Vice President, etc.; Peer Health Educator

7. Off-Campus Experiences ⓘ

Internships in administrative areas of any health-related organization; internships in a government office that deals with healthcare or public health; any kind of conference presentation for development...

12. Language Details ⓘ

Hospitals are required to have certified interpreters in multiple languages; just about ANY second language can be useful
